HAVE YOUR SAY ON TRANSPORT

Dorset and BCP Councils have launched <u>a public consultation on their</u> joint Local Transport Plan (closes 3 March). It will "set out how transport is delivered to meet some of the demanding challenges facing the area, covering all types of transport, as well as road safety and maintenance. The new plan is needed to ensure we can travel safely and easily, whilst reducing carbon emissions and protecting the landscape that makes BCP and Dorset so special. All this must be done while maintaining economic growth and improving transport choices, accessibility, and experiences for all".

Dorset Councillor Belinda Bawden is organising a public event to discuss the Local Transport Plan as well as the town council's developing Future Transport Vision and proposal for a 20mph zone - **starting at 3pm on Tuesday February 20.** The venue will either be the Jubilee Pavilion or the Guildhall.

There will also be public meeting in Charmouth from 10am to 1pm in The Elms.

The Local Transport Plan will shape our communities, connections and future mobility options for the next 15 to 20 years. **Come along and help shape your future town!**

SEED SWAP - SATURDAY MARCH 2

Amazing Seeds for All

Our seed gatherers met again this week and packeted 245 envelopes of fresh seed ready for our swap on 2 March.

The veg include peas, *White Emergo* runner beans, coriander *Santo*, frilly lettuce mix, pak choi, rocket, squash, salad onion, *Really Red Deer Tongue* lettuce, mustard salad leaves and *Rainbow* chard. Flowers include a beautiful variety of honesty – Lunaria annual *Chedglow* – with purple flowers and dark chocolate coloured leaves.

Whether you are growing on a windowsill, in pots or in a garden the aim is to distribute open-pollinated seeds freely to existing and potential new gardeners.


